

Minutes of the 13 November 2017
Regular Meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners
Held at 6:00 o'clock p.m. in the Yancey County Courtroom
Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, North Carolina

Present at the 13 November 2017 meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners were: Chairman Johnny Riddle, Commissioner Jill Austin, Commissioner Mark Ledford, Commissioner John Stallings, Commissioner Jeff Whitson, County Manager Nathan Bennett, Clerk to the Board Jason Robinson, County Attorney Donny Laws, Planning and Economic Development Director Jamie McMahan, members of the media, and members of the general public.

Call to Order and Approval of Agenda

Chairman Riddle called the meeting to order and asked Commissioner Stallings to deliver the invocation. After the invocation, Commissioner Whitson led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Riddle then asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Stallings made a motion to approve the agenda. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ledford. The vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment A).

Public Comment

Four individuals: Wanda Woodby, Matt Willig, Heather Dawes, and Jim Parlier all spoke in favor of the independent redistricting and anti-corruption resolutions. The next person to speak before the Board was Dr. John Boyd, President of Mayland Community College. Dr. Boyd wanted to remind the Board about the Christmas Social at his home. The next person to speak before the Board was Tom Robinson who spoke about the evils of the immigration lottery.

Consent Agenda

The Board next moved to the consent agenda portion of the agenda. On the consent agenda for November was approval of the October 9th regular meeting minutes and the November 2nd special meeting minutes. In addition, the Yancey County Finance Office asked to approve budget amendments #1 and #2 for the 2017-18 fiscal year (Attachment B). Finally the consent agenda contains the October tax collection report, which is for informational purposes only (Attachment C). Commissioner Whitson made a motion to approve the consent agenda and it was seconded by Commissioner Stallings. The vote to approve was unanimous.

Resolutions

The Board next took up consideration of two resolutions that had been presented at the September meeting but had not been approved at the time and was asked to be rewritten. Chairman Riddle asked the clerk to read aloud the first resolution dealing with independent redistricting. Upon reading of the resolution, Commissioner Stallings made a motion to approve the resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to approve was 3-2 with Chairman Riddle, Commissioners Austin and Stallings voting for the approval and Commissioners Ledford and Whitson voting against the approval (Attachment D). Chairman Riddle then asked the clerk to read aloud the resolution dealing with campaign finance reform and anti-corruption. Upon hearing the reading of the resolution, Commissioner Whitson made a motion to approve the resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Austin and the vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment E).

County Manager Report

The Board next heard from County Manager Nathan Bennett. Mr. Bennett stated that he had received notification from the governor's office that Yancey County has been approved by the Appalachian Regional Commission for a \$300,000 upon the recommendation from the governor's office. This grant will be used for the final extension of the sewer line from Micaville to Burnsville. Mr. Bennett also updated the Board on dates of events that were coming up before the December meeting. Commissioner Stallings asked for an update on Blue Ridge Elementary School. Planning and Economic Development Director Jamie McMahan gave the Board an update on Blue Ridge Elementary School. According to Mr. McMahan, the project is still on schedule and there has been no material delay. The footers for the building should be done by the end of November with a total completion date of spring/summer of 2019. Mr. Bennett also informed the Board about the veteran's honor program that provides discount cards that are being offered by the Yancey County Register of Deeds office.

County Attorney Business

County Attorney Donny Laws stated that he had nothing for the Board.


Commissioner Business




Having no further business Commissioner Ledford made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to adjourn was unanimous.



NOTES TO BUDGET AMENDMENT # 1

The purpose of this budget amendment is to increase several expenditure line items that are expected to or have come in at a higher amount than is available in the line item. Line # 1 increases the Construction & Repair Courthouse line item by \$7,600, the costs were associated with the Freedom Monument and the installation of heating and air upgrades in the Courthouse. Line # 2 increases the Construction & Repair Dept of Social Services line item by \$2,000 which replaced an air conditioning unit at the building on Pensacola Road. Line # 3 increases the worker's compensation line item by \$17,185 because wages are estimated at the beginning of the year and then are adjusted by actual figures at the end of the year and billed for. Lines # 4, 5, & 6 are all related to the inmate taken into custody on October 25, 2017; the inmate was ill and had to be transported to Mission Hospital where several procedures were performed on him. He was taken into the Department of Correction custody on October 31, 2017. During the hospital stay the inmate had to have two guards 24 hours a day due to his charges. We are responsible for a \$10,000 deductible on his hospital bill (Line 5), the cost of paying out Deputies to man the hospital room (Line 4), and the monthly cost of housing him with the Dept of Corrections until June 30 (Line 6). Line # 7 increased by \$ 8,763 to replace the repeater on Phillips Knob for Emergency Communications; the Town of Burnsville paid a portion of the bill. Line # 8-11 reduced the recycling coordinator salary in half because one has not been hired. Line # 12 was to increase the incentive given to Altec Industries due to additional equipment they were being taxed on. Lines 13-15 were reduced to offset these increase in expenditures. This amendment did not change the overall 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Budget of \$22,047,874.

NOTES TO BUDGET AMENDMENT # 2

The purpose of this amendment was to decrease the funding DSS receives for day care subsidies. The state now pays the vendor directly instead of passing thru the County. This amendment reduced the budget by \$138,838 to \$21,909,036.

WHEREAS, legislators from both parties have historically developed districts to favor the incumbent party's majority; and


WHEREAS, in order to have fair elections, a more equal way of determining districts should be developed, including passage of independent redistricting legislation; and



WHEREAS, it is the right of all citizens to have access to their elected representatives; and




WHEREAS, federal agencies such as the Federal Election Commission need to do more to enforce the campaign finance and anti-corruption rules that already exist;
